Day 1 - Arrive Singapore

On arrival in Singapore, you will be met and transferred to the luxurious Vagabond Hotel (or similar), where you will be staying for 2 nights. Settle in and relax after your flight. Perhaps begin your holiday with a Singapore Sling at the hotel bar. You may also like to head out and wander around Marina Bay with its tempting restaurants and entertainment venues.




Day 2 - Singapore

You have a full day at leisure in Singapore today. This fascinating city has many distinct districts to explore. Whether you want to discover Tao-Buddhist temples in Chinatown, take a bumboat tour from Clark Quay or shop until you drop on Orchard Road, there's something for everyone here. After a long day of exploration, perhaps enjoy some authentic Malay food in Kampong Glam or swim in one of the city's huge outdoor, palm fringed swimming pools.



Day 3 - Board The Eastern & Oriental Express

Spend another morning in Singapore before heading to Woodlands station to begin your luxurious journey aboard the Eastern & Oriental Express, bound for Bangkok. Once onboard, settle into your private cabin as the train crosses the Straits of Johor and continues on through southern Malaysia. Dinner will be served in one of the train's opulent dining cars. Afterwards, why not head to the Bar Car to relax with fellow travellers before retiring to your cabin, which will have been transformed into an inviting bedroom.



Day 4 - Travel Through Malaysia

After breakfast this morning, the train arrives at Kuala Kangsar. Disembark for a tour of the grand Ubudiah Mosque, the Royal Museum of Perak, housed in the beautiful Istana Kenangan (Remembrance Palace) and the Sultan Shah Gallery. Back aboard the train, enjoy an afternoon at your own leisure as you watch the passing scenery from your cabin or the observation coach. In the evening, enjoy a decadent dinner on board.



Day 5 - River Kwai Bridge And Arrival In Bangkok

Enjoy a leisurely breakfast this morning, before disembarking at Kanchanaburi station for a guided river cruise along the River Kwai. You also have the opportunity to join a visit to an informative war museum and optional war cemetery. Back aboard the train, enjoy a final meal in the restaurant cars before arriving into Bangkok. Make your own way to the Amari Watergate Park (or similar) for a 2-night stay. Head out to explore this city and sovereign state in the afternoon, or choose to simply relax and unwind in your hotel, making use of some of the luxurious facilities on offer.



Day 6 - Bangkok

Thailand's capital city is an exuberant metropolis, famous for its vibrant street life and golden shrines. Highlights of any visit here include the Royal Palace District, encompassing the Grand Palace and the Emerald Buddha Temple (Wat Pra Kaew), the city's colourful and chaotic Chinatown and the Damnoen Saduak floating market. You can also see the gigantic golden Reclining Buddha at Wat Pho and enjoy a traditional Thai massage at the end of a busy day of sightseeing.



Day 7 - Bangkok To London

Your holiday comes to an end today as you check out of your hotel and take a private transfer to the airport for your flight back to the UK (not included).
